The programme included hands-on activities, experiential learning, group discussion and role playing. Following the training, they sat through and passed an assessment to qualify as Youth Mentors.

On 13 October, the Youth Mentors received their certificates from Mr Jagjit Singh Sekhon, Chairman of the Sikh Welfare Council. Several leaders of the Sikh Community were also present to support this young group of mentors.

Three of the graduating mentors, Amreet, Heershan and Simran, also shared their experience in working with their mentees. They related how they broke the communication barriers to form a relationship based on friendship and trust.



Online Fundraising / Donations:

Providing convenience to donors

Those who have visited the Sikh Welfare Council's website this year would have noticed a substantial change. In early 2012, the website was completely revamped and is now more informative. Besides information about the organisation and its wide range of services, the site also offers several new features. One of the feature is the ability to accept online donations and run donation campaigns.

Here's a list of some of the features of the system:

- 1. Allow users to make one-time and recurring donations.
- 2. Make payments online via Paypal, a well-known and secure payment gateway. Those who do not have Paypal accounts can still donate using their credit cards.
- 3. The system satisfies regulatory requirements by helping to collect basic donor information.
- 4. Donors and the site's admin receive confirmation emails when online donations are received.
- 5. Ability of donors to pay for payment gateway charges as well so that the organisation receives the full donation amount (without fee deductions)
- 6. Site admin can manage donors list from the site's administrative console.
- 7. The system also includes a Campaigns feature, which allows the organisation to solicit for donations for a specific purpose (e.g. for earthquake victims, etc). An unlimited number of campaigns can be created and the donation progress for each campaign can be tracked. Donors can therefore have the option to choose a campaign to which they want to donate.
