HEB - ASHRAM



The Ashram has been in existence since 1999. It has been assisting substance abusers and penal offenders who undergo rehabilitation and helps to facilitate their reintegration into society. Since January 2013, SIWEC has been working closely with them and have sent volunteers, counsellors and an IT Trainer to teach the residents computer skills and knowledge to prepare them for the working life upon their completion of their stay at the Ashram. Yishun Gurdwara provides langgar once a week, as a great gesture of support.

SIWEC appreciates the volunteers' valuable time given and humble services that they provide to the Ashram.

Hospital Visit



One of the services provided by SIWEC is to visit patients in the hospitals. The purpose of the visit is to provide comfort and care, and assistance, if required.

SIWEC makes about 8 to 10 monthly visits to various hospitals in Singapore. Each visit lasts between 30 to 40 minutes. Currently, we have 47 healthcare ambassadors who are registered nurses providing this service on behalf of SIWEC.
