SIKH WELFARE COUNCIL (SIWEC) Annual Report 2009

1. INTRODUCTION

The Sikh Welfare Council (SIWEC) has successfully completed another successful year of service to the Community. SIWEC provides a comprehensive range of programs and services to address the diverse welfare concerns of the Sikh Community. This ranges from financial assistance (F/A) to needy families to provide comprehensive support to bereaved families. Audited accounts for 2009 are attached to the Report.

SIWEC wishes to thank the Sikh community and other well wishers for their generous support to its programs and activities.

2. IPC STATUS

SIWEC achieved a milestone when it received the IPC status on the 5th September 2009. This would allow all donors to receive generous tax deductions for their contributions. Receiving IPC status also means that SIWEC would have to undertake more stringent scrutiny of its expenses and accounts.

3.. FINANCIAL AND FOOD ON THE TABLE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Financial and Food on the table Assistance Program includes the delivery of Food Rations and Financial Assistance to needy Sikh families. The details of the two components for 2009 are as shown below.

a) Food Rations Delivery (F/R)

SIWEC continued to provide monthly food rations to needy Sikhs and a few non-Sikhs. As of August 2009 SIWEC delivered rations once every 2 months to reduce processing expenses and to provide more flexibility to recipients. (See table 1 below)

b) Financial Assistance Program (F/A)

SIWEC also continued to serve the financial needs of the poor Sikh families. (See table 1 below)

6. THE PRISONS/DRC VISITS AND COUNSELING PROGRAM

The purpose of this program is to:-

- Provide spiritual and rehabilitative counselling to Sikh inmates.
- Study the needs of Sikh inmates in jail.
- Provide a link between the inmates and their families if the need arises.
- Assist the Sikh inmates in finding meaningful employment upon release.
- Provide follow up counselling for inmates after being released.

Celebrations

As an annual activity, Sikh inmates are visited for Vesakhi and Guru Nanak Dev Ji's Gurpurb celebrations annually. Brief prayers are conducted and refreshments served.

7. AFTERCARE /REHABILITATION (PRISONS/DRCS)

3 inmates were released in 2009 and their employment arranged.

8. THE HOSPITAL VISITS PROGRAM

The Welfare Officers carried out hospital visits upon request, referral from public and calls from the hospital staff. The type of cases normally visited varied from terminally ill patients, to those under long term hospitalization. Free ambulance service was also provided to needy patients to meet their hospital appointments.

9. FAMILY BEREAVEMENT PROGRAM

- SIWEC provides families of the bereaved with social, emotional and spiritual support during their time of grief. SIWEC looks into various needs of the family by providing guidance on procedural and ceremonial matters for the funeral. The following are some of the services provided:
- Booking of the crematorium,
- Arranging for the hearse (and driving if necessary),
- Assisting with obituaries,
- Making transport arrangements,
- Buying of items for funerals,
- Assisting in bathing the body,
- Booking the Gurdwara for prayers,
- Assistance in ash collection,
- Providing follow up grief counseling and
- Providing assistance during the Anthim Ardas (final prayers).

62 cases of bereavement were handled by Sikh Welfare Council in 2009.

10. HOUSE VISITS AND SUPPORT PROGRAM

All SIWEC clients were personally visited by the new Chair of SIWEC in July 2009. Of these, 2 declined to be visited.

The objective of this comprehensive visit was:-

- To review needs of recipients
- To collect feedback about our Food on the table program
- To review and recommend changes /enhancements to the program.

11. ASSISTANCE TO THE SINGAPORE SIKH EDUCATION FOUNDATION (SSEF)

SIWEC also assisted the SSEF with the assessment of cases seeking assistance for Free Punjabi education, free books and uniforms in Jan 2008. SIWEC carried out interviews, assessment and recommended cases for EXCO's approval. (See below)

SIWEC was informed that the ladies were starting a Welfare Fund from Nov 09 to March 2010 by getting every female member to contribute a minimum of \$10 monthly for 6 months.

MP Inderjit Singh launched the Welfare Day Fund Raising by the ladies on 21st October 2009.

15. PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

I. Children's mentoring Program

This would involve the setting up of a program to look into the educational needs of the children of the needy and under performing children.

II. Adoption & Fostering of Sikh Children

SIWEC has met up with MYCS to review how abandoned Sikh children can be put under the foster care of Sikh families. SIWEC proposes to set up a system whereby Sikh children under such circumstances are taken care of in an environment which reflects their religion, culture and heritage.

III. Health Program

SIWEC will also be actively involved in assisting the needy in their health issues, such as in providing free ambulance services, house visits by volunteer nurses, etc.
